

# PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE III JOB DESCRIPTION

## **NATURE OF WORK**

Under general supervision, provides public health nursing services for Lewis County residents to promote, maintain, and restore good health in support of the State and County goals.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

The following duties **ARE NOT** intended to serve as a comprehensive list of all duties performed by all employees in this classification, only a representative summary of the primary duties and responsibilities. Incumbent(s) may not be required to perform all duties listed and may be required to perform additional, position-specific duties.

- Manages assigned staff; develops goals and priorities, assigns tasks and projects, and evaluates performance; develops staff skills and training plans and coordinates cross-training of staff.
- Participates in the development of plans, programs, policies, and procedures; establishes goals, objectives and priorities.
- Trains, supervises, and evaluates the performance of assigned personnel; monitors staff for compliance with departmental policies, procedures, and regulatory requirements and compliance.
- Provides employee supervision and conducts evaluation.
- Assists with the preparation and monitoring of assigned budget to ensure compliance with funding requirements.
- Assists in grant writing and grant compliance and requirements.
- Conducts epidemiological investigations; analyzes index case and subsequent infections, reports findings and makes recommendations for prevention, control and cure of diseases and pathogens.
- Conducts public health assessments and screenings.
- Provides case management for state programs; interviews and observes patients to ascertain medical history and current condition; evaluates medical conditions and home environment; develops case plans and coordinates health and community services.
- Assists clients with individual training and assistance as needed; provides nursing services, general and special health counseling, patient care instructions, and treatment services.
- Supports and enhances the patients' physical and emotional stability; explains nature of illness, plan of care, procedures and treatments to patient, family, and significant others.
- Performs nursing procedures and designated medical treatments within scope of authority; observes and assesses patients' conditions and behavior; reports significant changes to physician.
- Prepares correspondence, reports, referrals, patient histories, and narrative nursing activity reports; updates and maintains a variety of files, records, charts, and other documents; maintains appropriate records and prepares reports as required.
- Reviews and interprets reports for appropriate dissemination of information.

• Confers and collaborates with other health care professionals to assure effective continuum of care.

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- Presents patient and family teaching programs based on identified health care goals.
- Coordinates nursing services with other community service programs and agencies.
- Assists in planning and coordinating appropriate agency and community responses to disease outbreaks; participates on public health emergency response teams as needed.
- Maintains absolute confidentiality of work-related issues, patient records, personnel records and County information; complies with the confidentiality standards of the Privacy Act of 1974, {U.S.C. § 552A} as amended, and HIPAA policies and procedures.
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# **WORKING ENVIRONMENT / PHYSICAL DEMANDS:**

Work is performed in a standard office environment and off-site environments, including patient homes and clinic facilities; work involves light physical demands and frequent use of a personal computer.

#### **DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS:**

This is the supervisory level position in the Public Health Nurse job series; incumbents work under limited supervision and make decisions within a designated scope of authority; two years' experience is required.

#### **EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS:**

Bachelors Degree in Nursing; AND two (2) year's experience as a Registered Nurse in public health programs.

A valid Driver's License is required. Must possess a current Washington State license as a Registered Professional Nurse.

- Operating a personal computer utilizing standard and specialized software.
