POSITION SUMMARY

The Emergency Preparedness Coordinator is a key member of the Lewis County Public Health & Social Services (LCPHSS) team. This position works to ensure the county is ready to respond effectively to public health emergencies, natural disasters, and other incidents that threaten community well-being.

The Coordinator develops, implements, and maintains public health emergency response plans. They create preparedness trainings and exercises for the department and serve as a liaison with community partners. The Coordinator also supports public health response efforts during incidents and provides technical assistance and guidance to LCPHSS staff and community partners on best practices in emergency response.

This position is non-represented and reports to the LCPHSS Deputy Director.

Established in 1845, Lewis County was named for Meriwether Lewis of the Lewis and Clark expedition. The County spans 2,408 square miles with an estimated population of more than 85,000. Its county seat is located in historic Chehalis, a charming community rich in history and culture.
